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I. PARTIES

- 1.1. Plaintiff Hassan Farah resides in King County, Washington, and was employed by Hertz Transportation, Inc. as a shuttle driver at the Sea-Tac Airport location until terminated in 2011. Plaintiff is a practicing member of the Muslim religion. Plaintiff is a person of color who was born in Somalia and who speaks English with an accent (jointly, the plaintiffs will be referred to as "Hertz Plaintiffs 1-25").
- 1.2. Plaintiff Ileys Omar resides in King County, Washington, and was employed by Hertz Transportation, Inc. as a shuttle driver at the Sea-Tac Airport location until terminated in 2011. Plaintiff is a practicing member of the Muslim religion. Plaintiff is a person of color who was born in Somalia and who speaks English with an accent.
- 1.3. Plaintiff Marian Mumin resides in King County, Washington, and was employed by Hertz Transportation, Inc. as a shuttle driver at the Sea-Tac Airport location until terminated in 2011. Plaintiff is a practicing member of the Muslim religion. Plaintiff is a person of color who was born in Somalia and who speaks English with an accent.
- 1.4. Plaintiff Dahir Jama resides in King County, Washington, and was employed by Hertz Transportation, Inc. as a shuttle driver at the Sea-Tac Airport location until terminated in 2011. Plaintiff is a practicing member of the Muslim religion. Plaintiff is a person of color who was born in Somalia and who speaks English with an accent.

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1.5. Plaintiff Fouzia M. Mohamud resides in King County, Washington, and was employed by Hertz Transportation, Inc. as a shuttle driver at the Sea-Tac Airport location until terminated in 2011. Plaintiff is a practicing member of the Muslim religion. Plaintiff is a person of color who was born in Somalia and who speaks English with an accent.

- 1.6. Plaintiff Marian Ali resides in King County, Washington, and was employed by Hertz Transportation, Inc. as a shuttle driver at the Sea-Tac Airport location until terminated in 2011. Plaintiff is a practicing member of the Muslim religion. Plaintiff is a person of color who was born in Somalia and who speaks English with an accent.
- 1.7. Plaintiff Abdiaziz Abdulle resides in King County, Washington, and was employed by Hertz Transportation, Inc. as a shuttle driver at the Sea-Tac Airport location until terminated in 2011. Plaintiff is a practicing member of the Muslim religion. Plaintiff is a person of color who was born in Somalia and who speaks English with an accent.
- 1.8. Plaintiff Saalim Abukar resides in King County, Washington, and was employed by Hertz Transportation, Inc. as a shuttle driver at the Sea-Tac Airport location until terminated in 2011. Plaintiff is a practicing member of the Muslim religion. Plaintiff is a person of color who was born in Somalia and who speaks English with an accent.
- 1.9. Plaintiff Mohamed Ismail resides in King County, Washington, and was employed by Hertz Transportation, Inc. as a shuttle driver at the Sea-Tac Airport

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location until terminated in 2011. Plaintiff is a practicing member of the Muslim religion. Plaintiff is a person of color who was born in Somalia and who speaks English with an accent.

- 1.10. Plaintiff Sudi Hashi resides in King County, Washington, and was employed by Hertz Transportation, Inc. as a shuttle driver at the Sea-Tac Airport location until terminated in 2011. Plaintiff is a practicing member of the Muslim religion. Plaintiff is a person of color who was born in Somalia and who speaks English with an accent.
- 1.11. Plaintiff Hali Abdulle resides in King County, Washington, and was employed by Hertz Transportation, Inc. as a shuttle driver at the Sea-Tac Airport location until terminated in 2011. Plaintiff is a practicing member of the Muslim religion. Plaintiff is a person of color who was born in Somalia and who speaks English with an accent.
- 1.12. Plaintiff Murayad Abdullahi resides in King County, Washington, and was employed by Hertz Transportation, Inc. as a shuttle driver at the Sea-Tac Airport location until terminated in 2011. Plaintiff is a practicing member of the Muslim religion. Plaintiff is a person of color who was born in Somalia and who speaks English with an accent.
- 1.13. Plaintiff Zainab Aweis resides in King County, Washington, and was employed by Hertz Transportation, Inc. as a shuttle driver at the Sea-Tac Airport location until terminated in 2011. Plaintiff is a practicing member of the Muslim religion. Plaintiff is a person of color who was born in Somalia and who speaks

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English with an accent.

- 1.14. Plaintiff Fardowsa Aden resides in King County, Washington, and was employed by Hertz Transportation, Inc. as a shuttle driver at the Sea-Tac Airport location until terminated in 2011. Plaintiff is a practicing member of the Muslim religion. Plaintiff is a person of color who was born in Somalia and who speaks English with an accent.
- 1.15. Plaintiff Maryan Muse resides in King County, Washington, and was employed by Hertz Transportation, Inc. as a shuttle driver at the Sea-Tac Airport location until terminated in 2011. Plaintiff is a practicing member of the Muslim religion. Plaintiff is a person of color who was born in Somalia and who speaks English with an accent.
- 1.16. Plaintiff Asli Mohamed resides in King County, Washington, and was employed by Hertz Transportation, Inc. as a shuttle driver at the Sea-Tac Airport location until terminated in 2011. Plaintiff is a practicing member of the Muslim religion. Plaintiff is a person of color who was born in Somalia and who speaks English with an accent.
- 1.17. Plaintiff Sahra Gelle (a/k/a Hani Huseen) resides in King County, Washington, and was employed by Hertz Transportation, Inc. as a shuttle driver at the Sea-Tac Airport location until terminated in 2011. Plaintiff is a practicing member of the Muslim religion. Plaintiff is a person of color who was born in Somalia and who speaks English with an accent.
 - 1.18. Plaintiff Asha Farah resides in King County, Washington, and was

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employed by Hertz Transportation, Inc. as a shuttle driver at the Sea-Tac Airport location until terminated in 2011. Plaintiff is a practicing member of the Muslim religion. Plaintiff is a person of color who was born in Somalia and who speaks English with an accent.

- 1.19. Plaintiff Ali Adam Abdi resides in King County, Washington, and was employed by Hertz Transportation, Inc. as a shuttle driver at the Sea-Tac Airport location until terminated in 2011. Plaintiff is a practicing member of the Muslim religion. Plaintiff is a person of color who was born in Somalia and who speaks English with an accent.
- 1.20. Plaintiff Muna Mohamed resides in King County, Washington, and was employed by Hertz Transportation, Inc. as a shuttle driver at the Sea-Tac Airport location until terminated in 2011. Plaintiff is a practicing member of the Muslim religion. Plaintiff is a person of color who was born in Somalia and who speaks English with an accent.
- 1.21. Plaintiff Farah Geedi resides in King County, Washington, and was employed by Hertz Transportation, Inc. as a shuttle driver at the Sea-Tac Airport location until terminated in 2011. Plaintiff is a practicing member of the Muslim religion. Plaintiff is a person of color who was born in Somalia and who speaks English with an accent.
- 1.22. Plaintiff Ahmed Hassan Hussein resides in King County, Washington, and was employed by Hertz Transportation, Inc. as a shuttle driver at the Sea-Tac Airport location until terminated in 2011. Plaintiff is a practicing member of the

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Muslim religion. Plaintiff is a person of color who was born in Somalia and who speaks English with an accent.

- 1.23. Plaintiff Ibrahim Salah resides in King County, Washington, and was employed by Hertz Transportation, Inc. as a shuttle driver at the Sea-Tac Airport location until terminated in 2011. Plaintiff is a practicing member of the Muslim religion. Plaintiff is a person of color who was born in Somalia and who speaks English with an accent.
- 1.24. Plaintiff Ahmed A. Hirsi resides in King County, Washington, and was employed by Hertz Transportation, Inc. as a shuttle driver at the Sea-Tac Airport location until terminated in 2011. Plaintiff is a practicing member of the Muslim religion. Plaintiff is a person of color who was born in Somalia and who speaks English with an accent.
- 1.25. Plaintiff Mohamud A. Hassan resides in King County, Washington, and was employed by Hertz Transportation, Inc. as a shuttle driver at the Sea-Tac Airport location until terminated in 2011. Plaintiff is a practicing member of the Muslim religion. Plaintiff is a person of color who was born in Somalia and who speaks English with an accent.
- 1.26. Defendant Hertz Transportation, Inc. ("Hertz") is a for-profit corporation organized under the laws of the State of Delaware and doing business in King County, Washington.
- 1.27. Defendant Matt Hoehne ("Hoehne") is employed by Hertz as the Airport Manager. On information and belief, he resides in King County.

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1.28. Defendant Todd Harris ("Harris") is employed by Hertz as the Area Manager. On information and belief, he resides in King County.

II. JURISDICTION AND VENUE

- 2.1 Jurisdiction is proper in the State of Washington because all parties reside or transact business here. The Superior Court of King County, State of Washington, has subject matter jurisdiction over this action pursuant to RCW 2.08.010, RCW 4.28.020, and RCW 4.28.080.
- 2.2 Venue is proper in and for the County of King, State of Washington, because Hertz does regular business here, the individual defendants reside in King County, and the facts surrounding this claim occurred in King County.

III. FACTS

- 3.1. At Sea-Tac airport, most of Hertz Plaintiffs 1-25 shuttle rental cars for cleaning and refueling during the work day. Some of Hertz Plaintiffs 1-25 are leads. Leads drive the vans that carry the workers to and from the car transport locations.
- 3.2. For approximately 15 years, employees of Hertz who follow Islam, and who work for Hertz at Sea-Tac, have been permitted to stop work to pray briefly during the work day without clocking out.
- 3.3. Sea-Tac has numerous employees from different companies who follow Islam and who pray during the work day without clocking out.
 - 3.4. Muslim men and women sometimes pray separately from each other.
- 3.5. At Sea-Tac, there is a designated area set up for Muslim men to pray, which has existed since 1998 ("Men's Mosque"). There are partitions separating the

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Men's Mosque from the floor and providing privacy to the workers who pray.

- 3.6. At Sea-Tac, there is a designated area set up for Muslim women to pray, which has existed for the past several years ("Women's Mosque"). There are partitions separating the Women's Mosque from the floor and providing privacy to the workers who pray.
- 3.7. Typically, Hertz Plaintiffs 1-25 would pray two-times during a work day, and the prayer would last from 3-5 minutes.
- 3.8. Hertz Plaintiffs 1-25 prayed while at work until on or about September 30, 2011, at which time Defendants Hertz, Hoehne, and Harris changed that practice and implemented discipline and then termination of Hertz Plaintiffs 1-25 allegedly for praying at work without clocking out. Religious, race, and national origin were substantial factors in the decision to discipline and terminate Hertz Plaintiffs 1-25 in October 2011.
- 3.9. Hertz Plaintiffs 1-25 are Teamsters, and the contract between Hertz and the Teamsters does not require employees to clock out before prayer. The contract between Hertz and the Teamsters, which applied to Hertz Plaintiffs 1-25 in September 2011, had been signed months earlier by the parties and was in effect at the time.
- 3.10. For approximately the last 15 years, Hertz employees working at Sea-Tac have not been required to clock out for bathroom breaks or smoke breaks.
- 3.11. One or more Hertz Plaintiffs 1-25 leads have been removed from their positions and demoted without cause prior to their suspension and termination from Hertz. Religious, race, and national origin were substantial factors in the decision to

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remove one or more Hertz Plaintiffs 1-25 from the lead position.

- 3.12. In 2007, some of Hertz Plaintiffs 1-25 filed discrimination claims with the EEOC, which resulted in a settlement on or about May 20, 2009. Retaliation for opposing discrimination was a substantial factor in the decision to terminate Hertz Plaintiffs 1-25 in October 2011.
- 3.13. Defendants Hertz, Harris, and Hoehne have created a hostile work environment that began prior to the EEOC filings and continued through 2011. Some of their actions include: not calling Hertz Plaintiffs 1-25 by name; using a harsh tone when speaking to Hertz Plaintiffs 1-25; putting some of Hertz Plaintiffs 1-25 in unsafe situations; peering into the Women's Mosque for no reason, repeatedly, with knowledge of its impropriety; entering the Women's Mosque for no reason; publicly and falsely accusing Hertz Plaintiffs 1-25 of not being clocked out for lunch without checking time cards first; publicly embarrassing Hertz Plaintiffs 1-25 in front of coworkers and customers by counseling them on false claims of work performance deficiencies; banging on the women's bathroom door and yelling through the door; falsely accusing some of Hertz Plaintiffs 1-25 of stealing keys; and giving disciplinary points to Hertz Plaintiffs 1-25 without cause.
- 3.14. Hertz is liable for the actions of its agents under the doctrine of respondent superior.

IV. CAUSES OF ACTION

4.1. Plaintiffs re-allege the facts set forth in paragraphs 3.1 - 3.14 above and incorporate same by reference.

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- 4.2. The facts set forth above state a claim against the defendants for intentional religious, race, and national origin discrimination in violation of the Washington Law Against Discrimination, RCW 49.60, *et seq*.
- 4.3. The facts set forth above state a claim against the defendants for intentionally creating a hostile work environment owing to religious, race, and national origin discrimination in violation of the Washington Law Against Discrimination, RCW 49.60 *et seq*.
- 4.4. The facts set forth above state a claim against the defendants for retaliation in violation of the Washington Law Against Discrimination, RCW 49.60.210.
- 4.5. The facts set forth above state a claim against the individual defendants for aiding and abetting discrimination in violation of the Washington Law Against Discrimination, RCW 49.60.220.

V. PRAYER FOR RELIEF

WHEREFORE, Plaintiffs pray for relief as follows:

- 5.1. Damages for back pay, front pay, lost benefits, and medical expenses in an amount to be proved at trial;
- 5.2. Damages for loss of enjoyment of life, pain and suffering, mental anguish, emotional distress, injury to reputation, and humiliation;
 - 5.3. Prejudgment interest in an amount to be proved at trial;
 - 5.4. Reasonable attorney's fees and costs;
 - 5.5. Declaratory relief for plaintiffs;
