I, CHELSEA ALTONA, declare that the following statement is true and correct:

- 1. My name is Chelsea Altona.
- 2. I am over the age of eighteen (18) and competent to make this declaration.
 - 3. I am a resident of Sumas in Whatcom County, WA.
- 4. I worked as a self-employed house cleaner for several months and then at Kid's Country Daycare for one month as a teacher.
 - 5. I became unemployed on March 19th, 2020.
- 6. I applied for unemployment benefits on April 2nd, 2020, because my employer asked me to wait as they decided whether to re-open for services.
- 7. I never received any Monetary Determination entitling me to benefits or denying me benefits. In the last week of April, my online account said I was approved, that my claim was pending, and that I worked at a place called A&R Cedar in Hoquiam, WA, but I have never even been to Hoquiam—much less worked there.
- 8. Other than this, I've never received a notification from ESD.

- 9. I have taken the following actions to address this issue with ESD: I've called over 200 hundred times. Each time I've called, I've probably stayed on hold for four hours at a time, sitting and waiting for someone to answer the phone. The first time I called, I talked with a lady who told me that it could be up to 4-6 weeks till I heard back from them. She said I had to wait and there was nothing that either of us could do to speed up the process. After four weeks of calling further, I got a hold of another person, and they also told me that there was nothing that I could do and I had to just wait. I've been calling almost every single day and have not received any further answers other than this. I've sent emails about whether I am going to ever receive my unemployment, but I have never received anything back from them.
- 10. I have been significantly and adversely affected in the following ways due to my not receiving my unemployment benefits: I lost my apartment, because I couldn't pay rent and my landlord gave me a notice to pay or quit before the eviction moratorium was in place. My two children and I had to move in with my parents. My children have grown out of their clothes and I haven't been able to get them new shoes, pants or shirts. I lost my car. The dealership took it back because I couldn't make the payments.

11. On a scale of 1-10 my level of stress is a 10. My fear is a little less because I have family helps out when and where they can. The stress is too much. I haven't been able to sleep and have only slept 10 hours this week. I understand that there are thousands of people going through the same thing that I am, and we all just want help. This is so stressful for everyone involved.

I declare under penalty of perjury under the laws of the State of Washington that the foregoing is true and correct to the best of my knowledge.
